Blooming Artists

Area High School art students display their work in the Museum's pioneer village, weekends in spring.

June 12-13 Fort Walla Walla Days & Western Art Show

Historic interpreters represent 19th century military encampments, as well as Lewis & Clark, the fur traders, and WWI. People of the Homeland Tribes present their stories, too. Noted artist David Partridge coordinates a display of western art by regional artists.

June 22 Explorers Kids Camp

A hands-on experience for kids age 9-11 to learn skills important to the famous explorers and the Indian people they met.

July 20 Pioneer Kids Camp

Hands-on day camp lets kids 9-11 experience life the pioneer way.

July 29 Heritage Quilt Festival

A popular annual display of some of the Museum's more than 90 heritage quilts.

August 22 Women's History Celebration

Women of the Living History Company commemorate the 90th anniversary of the ratification of the Constitution's 19th Amendment, guaranteeing American women's right to vote.

Tales o' the Trail

Our new children's reading circle. Volunteers read aloud books of regional historic interest for kids ages 4-9. Hands-on crafts and some light refreshments complete this half-hour program. Tales o' the Trail occurs at 1:00 pm on Sundays alternating with Oregon Trail Band performances throughout the season.

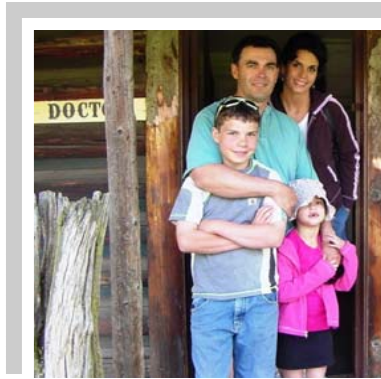
Living History Performances

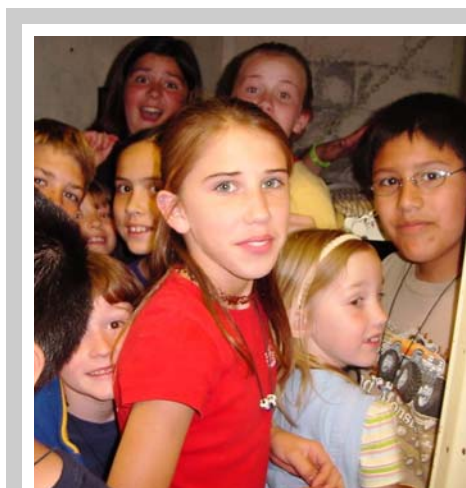

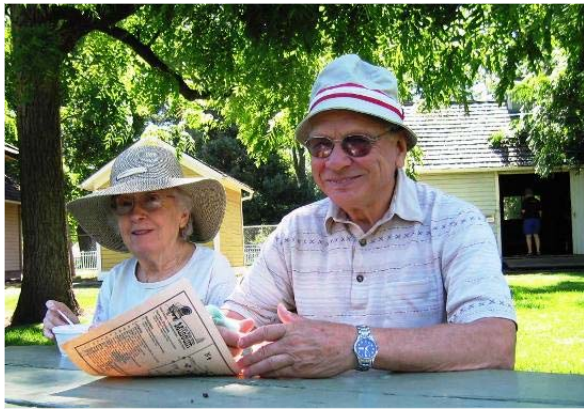
Fort Walla Walla Museum
